<u>DO</u>

- 1. <u>Do Be Transparent.</u> Let students and colleagues know before they disclose any information that you are a mandated reporter. This gives them the right to choose whether or not to share.
- 2. <u>Do Report.</u> If you suspect or witness any form of abuse, neglect, harm, or discrimination, it's important to report it promptly. Scan the QR Code below to file a report.
- Do Document. Report all known details, including dates, times, and descriptions of what was observed or reported.
- 4. <u>Do Follow Protocols.</u> Adhere to the reporting procedures set by Alma College to ensure that reports are handled appropriately.
- 5. <u>Do Seek Guidance</u>. If you're unsure about whether a situation warrants reporting, seek guidance from the Civil Rights/Title IX Team.





DO NOT

- 1. <u>Don't Ignore</u>. Mandated Reporters MUST report. Even if you're unsure or hesitant, it's important not to ignore signs of potential harm. Reporting is crucial to protecting those in vulnerable situations.
- 2. <u>Don't Promise Confidentiality.</u>
 While it's important to listen empathetically, avoid promising complete confidentiality if it conflicts with your obligation to report certain concerns.
- 3. <u>Don't Investigate Independently.</u> As a mandated reporter, your role is to report suspicions or concerns, not to investigate or intervene directly in potentially harmful situations.
- 4. <u>Don't Delay Reporting.</u> Timeliness is key when it comes to reporting. Delaying reporting can impact the safety and well-being of those involved. Mandated Reporters are expected to report within 24 hours.
- 5. <u>Don't Be Surprised</u>. Don't be surprised if you don't hear back. Once you report, it is out of your hands.
