#### **Health and Counceling Referrals**

- Students can be referred to the Wilcox Health Center for medical support.
- Counseling services are available to help students cope with emotional stress.

#### **No Contact Orders**

No Contact Orders can be issued to limit or prevent contact between the involved parties, ensuring safety and peace of mind.

#### **Academic and Work Accommodations**

- Adjustments to academic or work schedules and assignments can be made to reduce stress and ensure a safe environment.
- This might include changes in class schedules, assignment deadlines, or work shifts.

### **Living Arrangements**

Changes to living arrangements can be made to ensure the comfort and safety of the students involved.
